The history of "Zushi" (Altar cabinet) dates back to the Asuka period, as exemplified by the Tamamushi Shrine of Horyu-ji Temple. Originally, it was a tool for storing food and daily necessities. However, with the spread of Buddhism, it came to serve as a religious item to enshrine principal deities and memorial tablets. Today, beyond the realm of faith, it is also used to store keepsakes and amulets of loved ones.

Yoshiko Hasegawa Cloisonné Studio named this altar cabinet "Memory Box" in the hope of providing a space for "prayer" and "peace of mind" in today's hectic daily life. We hope that you will use it in your own way, for your loved ones and for yourself.
